SBI Foundation has launched a flagship program under its focus area of healthcare, India COVID-19 Health Alliance (ICHA) with USAID. It is supported by Xynteo Foundation and IPE Global PAHAL platform. The new collaborative healthcare programme will bolster and build on the current public healthcare system and the interventions to contain the spread of the coronavirus by working in the following areas:

- (i) Upgrade Health Infrastructure and Diagnostic Facilities;
- (ii) Research & Development to identify, design and support innovative solutions;
- (iii) Isolation, Quarantine and Shelter facilities;
- (iv) Address Mental Health Issues;
- (v) Capacity Building of Healthcare Professionals;
- (vi) General Awareness for public;
- (vii) Any other innovative areas for tackling the after-effects of COVID-19.

SBI Foundation has supported **Project ECHO™** in India which will provide training and capacity building through a tele-mentoring facility to healthcare professionals across 10 states in India. The Project has already commenced with capacity building training, in partnership with ECHO India, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) and National Health Missions, in 3 different states viz. Maharashtra, Punjab and Rajasthan with 7 more states to follow. Over 1,20,000 healthcare professionals

SBI Foundation has also started distribution of 10,000 freshly cooked meals per day to vulnerable individuals across Ahmedabad, Delhi/NCR, Vrindavan and Bangalore in partnership with Akshaya Patra Foundation. SBI Foundation has also provided dry ration kits in Mumbai in coordination with CORO India.

SBI Foundation has committed Rs. 30.00 crore for supplying ventilator, PPE Kits, food distribution and long term projects for tackling COVID-19 across all states in coordination with its Local Head Offices.
